APPROVED RISK ASSESSMENT CONSULTANTS CONFIRMED

Council have assembled a list of consultants to serve as an easily-accessed resource for Pomonal residents seeking fire risk assessment to assist in rebuilding homes.

The process is designed to flow as follows.

Residents are to contact a consultant/s from the list, and once they have decided which consultant's offered timeframe for reporting suits them, are to notify Council's Recovery Officer, John Matthews, advising of their preferred consultant.

The Recovery Officer will arrange a purchase order and email the consultant, confirming their appointment. The resident will be copied into this email. (If resident does not have email, Recovery Officer will contact resident directly.)

After this email is sent, the resident must contact the consultant to arrange a time for site inspection. The consultant will attend the property, complete their report and provide it to the resident. The consultant will also provide a copy of the report to Council, along with an invoice, which Council can then approve and remit.

A big reminder from the Brigade: Any large fire heaps that have been burnt, retaining heat and embers, are now to be fully extinguished. The Ararat municipality's Fire Danger Period (FDP) began on Monday 18 Nov, and fire restrictions will be in place until the cessation of the FDP on Thursday 1 May 2025.

POMONAL TRANSFER STATION

Pomonal Transfer Station has resumed normal operating hours, and fees and charges are still being waived for Pomonal residents until further notice.

Scrap metal is now being taken at Pomonal Transfer Station, but is limited to a maximum of three cubic metres.

To dispose of larger amounts of scrap metal, please call Manhari Metals on (03) 5352 3866.

Cleanaway Stawell is no longer taking waste free of charge, and any waste arriving at the site must be via a commercial operator or truck.

These changes are in line with State Government guidance on Disaster Waste Disposal.
